From the Pen of the Pastor...



Dear brothers and sisters,

Happy (early) Thanksgiving! After Mass in the morning, I plan on joining some of my family at my brother's house for what is always a fine feast. If I have time, I will stop by my sister's before for some celebrating there too. They usually join my brother's

family for desert, so I think I'll get to see them either way.

We as Catholics have more reasons than others to give thanks. As the priest prays at Mass, it is "our duty and our salvation always and everywhere to give You (God) thanks." We have the fullness of the faith in Jesus' Church, the Sacraments, His Word in the Scriptures, a share in the Body of Christ, the power of the fullness of His Holy Spirit, and so much more. As we pause to give thanks for the blessings we have received as individuals and a nation, may we also include in our prayers of thanks, gratitude for God's mercy and forgiveness, for Jesus suffering, dying and rising for each of us by name, for the gifts He gives us, especially His Holy Spirit, and for the abundant, perfectly happy life of heaven that is our destiny.
