Marriage: Arrangements should be made at least 12 months before the date of the marriage to take marriage preparation courses.

RCIA: Starts in the fall. Contact your respective parish office for times and dates.

Grow - Study....the faith
Excerpts From Pope Francis' New
Exhortation, Rejoice and Be Glad:

"REJOICE AND BE GLAD" (Mt 5:12), Jesus tells those persecuted or humiliated for his sake. The Lord asks everything of us, and in return he offers us true life, the happiness for which we were created. He wants us to be saints and not to settle for a bland and mediocre existence... The Letter to the Hebrews presents a number of testimonies that encourage us to "run with perseverance the race that is set before us" (12:1). It speaks of Abraham, Sarah, Moses, Gideon and others (cf. 11:1-12:3). Above all, it invites us to realize that "a great cloud of witnesses" (12:1) impels us to advance constantly towards the goal...The saints now in God's presence preserve their bonds of love and communion with us.

Each of us can say: "Surrounded, led and guided by the friends of God...I do not have to carry alone what, in truth, I could never carry alone. All the saints of God are there to protect me, to sustain me and to carry me"...

Nor need we think only of those already beatified and canonized...I like to contemplate the holiness present in the patience of God's people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. In their daily perseverance I see the holiness of the Church militant. Very often it is a holiness found in our next-door neighbors, those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence. We might call them "the middle class of holiness"...

With this Exhortation I would like to insist primarily on the call to holiness that the Lord addresses to each of us, the call that he also addresses, personally, to you: "Be holy, for I am holy" (Lev 11:44; cf. 1 Pet 1:16).

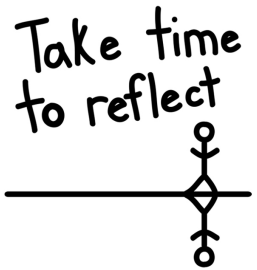
If you have been abused or victimized...

From the Pen of the Pastor



Dear brothers and sisters,

We are on the threshold of the greatest month of the year—May. May is dedicated to Mary. May is always full of the beauty of Spring and warmer weather. May is when I was born (thus the greatest month!). And May is the month, for our parish, when our children receive two of the sacraments of initiation: Holy Communion and Confirmation. Who doesn't love May!?

On Wednesday, May 2, our eighth graders will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation from our Bishop Boyea at St. Paul's in Owosso. I look forward to being able to be with them for this great gift of the Holy Spirit in their lives. Next weekend our second graders will be receiving their first Holy Communion. Please keep them and their families in your prayers in a special way this week. This is also a great opportunity for those of us who have been blessed to receive these sacraments, to give thanks to God for them and ask Him for the blessing of being renewed in the graces of these sacraments.

On April 9, the day after Divine Mercy Sunday, Pope Francis released an Apostolic Exhortation on Holiness called "*Rejoice and Be Glad*" (or *Gaudete et exsultate*, its official, Latin name). One essential part of being Catholic and living our faith is to spend time studying our faith (part of the GROW in GROW and GO). To help us in this endeavor, I thought it would be good to add a short excerpt from *Rejoice and Be Glad* in the next several bulletins. Check it out. I encourage you to go also to the Vatican web site (vatican.va) and read the whole thing for free.

Finally, the importance of human life seems to be on my mind this week. As always, the world presents a mixed, and often contradictory, message about the value of human life. Just this week, we read in the news about truckers who stopped under a bridge down on 696 in Detroit to save a man who was contemplating suicide. Message: human life is good. At the same time, we hear of a family who is fighting against a hospital in England to save the life of their young son (less than two years old), Alfie Evans, who the hospital wants to stop treatment. Message: human life is not always good. And then there are the two men, one in Toronto with a van and one in Nashville with a gun, who violently killed and injured others. Message: human life is good because we rightly condemn these acts as a society, but what are we doing to address the fact that many don't think life is good and would do such things.

Then there are the ongoing situations of how we treat the unborn, those fleeing war, violence and situations of grave injustice and poverty, immigrants (illegal or not) already living in our country, those subject to abuse and human trafficking, the elderly, sick and dying. Message: human life is not good if those in power decide it isn't. Indeed, when our rights as humans aren't based on simply being human, then those in power will always get to decide who has rights, even who is human, which always ends in injustice and acts of horror.

One blessing of our faith is to help us see clearly the infinite dignity of every human person, which helps guide our actions toward one another. May the month of May be a time when we confidently and lovingly witness to the world and our country the importance of every human life. What can and will you do to promote a culture of life this month? May we help our country be a place where wisdom, justice and the truth guide our actions.

May God bless our parish abundantly this week.

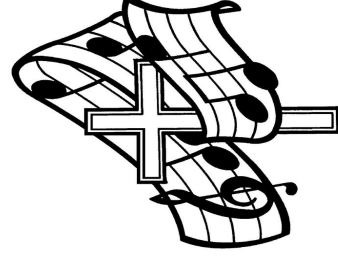
